Preparing for first grade

Preparing for first grade reading

- Recall the sequence of events in oral and written stories
- Discuss story elements such as plot, character, events, and setting
- Understand basic punctuation (capitalize first letter of a sentence, use periods and question marks, etc.)
- Identify the main idea and details in a story
- Print legibly
- Recognize single and plural forms of nouns
- Write in complete sentences
- Differentiate between fiction and nonfiction stories
- Read and correctly spell between 130 and 150 words

Preparing for first grade math

- Understand greater than, less than, lighter than, heavier than, the same as, etc.
- Recognize and write numbers up to 100
- Count by twos, fives, and 10s to 100
- Mentally add numbers to 10
- Add and subtract to 20
- Recognize pennies, nickels, dimes and quarters
- Tell time to the hour and the half hour
- Recognize shapes
- Identify, describe, and reproduce patterns with numbers, shapes, colors, or words
- Recognize simple mathematical symbols (e.g. -, +, <, >, =)
- Use measuring tools like rulers
- Read calendar, know days of the week, months of the year, and seasons
